GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF TASK(S) AND OBJECTIVES TO BE ACHIEVED

Background

To be based with the FAO Somalia, Fisheries Sector currently implementing a range of projects. In summary, we have Coastal Communities Against Piracy (CCAP) project funded by EU aiming to provide livelihood support to coastal communities and encourage young people to enter fishing as an alternative to a life of maritime crime. The sector is also contributing to the Youth Employment Somalia which has similar job – creation objectives in the coastal fisheries sector but working in Kismayo, Bossaso and Berbera. We are in the early stages of a project assisting fishermen out of Bossaso in improving safety and security at sea through installation of tracking and communication devices on selected vessels. Emergency and drought response projects are a smaller part of our work, but important especially in the riverine areas in the south of the country. Developing new proposals and seeking additional funds for the sector in Somalia is actively encouraged.

Under the overall supervision of the FAO Representative in Somalia and the technical supervision of the Project Manager, FAO Fisheries Sector, the intern will:

- 1. Support the design and implementation of projects within the FAO Somalia fisheries sector;
- 2. Make substantive technical input for developing fisheries-related project proposals;
- 3. Assist development of project proposals to be presented to donors;
- 4. Support the preparation of reports and other technical documents as required;
- 5. Conduct Missions into Somalia and worked with fishermen's and fisherwomen's groups and other community representatives;
- 6. Prepare technical progress reports and other documents as required;
- 7. Perform other related duties and activities within the Sector and wider FAO office as required;
