3rd World Small-Scale Fisheries Congress - Call for abstracts

The 3rd World Small-Scale Fisheries Congress (3WSFC), which will be held in Chiang Mai, Thailand, on 22-26 October 2018, is now calling for abstracts.

Abstracts can be submitted in three formats: **individual papers**, **team papers** or **special sessions**. Priorities will be given to abstracts that align closely with the congress main theme 'Transdisciplinarity and Transformation for the Future of Small-Scale Fisheries'.

The deadline for abstract submission is **February 15, 2018**.
